Job Hazard Analysis Things to Consider

COVID-19

COVID-19 is a new disease and **we are still learning about how it spreads** and the severity of illness it causes

The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.

- Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
 - Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes or talks.
 - These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.
 - Some recent studies have suggested that COVID-19 may be spread by people who are not showing symptoms.
 - Maintaining good social distance (about 6 feet) is very important in preventing the spread of COVID-19.
 - It may be possible that a person can get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or possibly their eyes
1. Are you able to maintain proper social distancing (at least 6 feet) between employees at all times?
 2. Are all employees wearing non-surgical face masks while at work?
 3. Do you need to provide PPE (face mask, Face shields, gloves or other)?
 4. Are you able to provide proper cleaning supplies for each work station? If yes, what is your cleaning schedule?
 5. Do we have all SDS sheets for all cleaning supplies?
 6. Do you have hand sanitizer available in common areas?
 7. Are you or your department responsible for a common area (Locker room Break room other? Can this be locked off and not used? Who is responsible for cleaning? What is the cleaning schedule?
 8. Do you share tools or equipment between employees? If yes how are you disinfecting tools between uses?
 9. How are you conducting meetings? Can you maintain social distancing during meetings and break times?

10. Are you going into other employee's works space during the course of your day? If yes how are you mitigating the risk of exposure?
11. How can you maintain contact tracing for your employees?
12. How are your employees going to report Covid-19 assessment results?
13. Do you or your staff need training or refresher on any of the following?
 - GHS, Hazard Communication and SDS Sheets.
 - COVID-19 Spread and symptoms
 - Workers Compensation related to COVID-19
 - PPE
